



Getting Started Checklist for Troop Volunteer Teams

Use this checklist to help you and your volunteer team get your troop off to a safe, organized and rewarding start. Remember, support is always available through your service unit and council staff.

- ☐ Meet with your troop volunteer team to discuss roles/responsibilities and decide the location, day, time and frequency of your Girl Scout meetings. ☐ Choose your meeting space. For tips, review page 37 of Volunteer Essentials. Plan your Friends & Family Meeting using the sample agenda. Consider support roles that friends & family can take in your troop. □ Send Friends & Family Meeting invite using the customizable Friends & Family Meeting Sample Invite Letter in the Resource Library and Forms. ☐ Register all girls and adults in your troop and volunteer team. ☐ Have parents/guardians complete and sign the Annual Girl Permission Form for each girl participating in Girl Scouts. Ensure that all volunteers and adults who work closely with the girls (or have access to their information) complete and submit a CORI Acknowledgement Form. All forms need to be verified in person by a GSEM authorized representative. □ Volunteers working with your troop must complete GSEM's Online Volunteer Agreement. This agreement must be completed annually. Fill out the Request for Troop Bank Account. Troops must have two non-related adult members as signers. Review Volunteer Essentials, Chapter 4 - Safety Wise for safety specifics. □ Explore the Safety Activity Checkpoints found in our Resource Library and Forms. ☐ Connect with your Service Unit Team to inquire about girl placement into your troop, and the dates/times/locations of service unit meetings and events. ☐ Plan your first few troop meetings using the First Three Meetings.
- □ Complete your Training Requirements
 - Take Girl Scouting 101, an online introduction to the Girl Scout program
 - Take Troop Pathway Orientation, prior to meeting with girls
 - Register for your Essentials session (level specific) to learn how to facilitate Journeys and help your girls earn skill building badges
- □ Read up on the 10 Essential Elements for creating a high-quality, fun filled experience for the girls. This online level-specific resource is an excellent place to get ideas for your Friends & Family meeting and to find ways to integrate the Girl Scout Leadership Experience into your activities.
